got weatherbug?

Thanks to the Tiger Paws, WWS now is part of the Weather Bug system! The sensors, control unit and internet communications were installed in the science department in the spring of 2008. All systems are now functional and providing real-time data for use in the weather units in our earth science classes this semester, and will provide similar information for the geology classes next semester. It is on display in the Commitment hallway.

Together, the WeatherBug data collection system and visual imaging capabilities from our satellite receiver provide a complete weather data and forecasting package. Earth Science and Geology students can track fronts, ground surface temperatures, water surface temperatures, precipitation, barometric pressure, wind speed and wind direction. In addition, when conditions warrant, we can access WeatherBug sensors from anywhere in the country. For example, when hurricane Ike threatened the Gulf Coast in September, we were able to observe real-time wind conditions from hundreds of other WeatherBug stations along the Texas and Louisiana coasts. We have also used the data stored from our system as well as other local WeatherBug systems to investigate the excessive rainfall from the storms of early September that caused much local flooding.

The WeatherBug display has generated much interest from students as they pass by in the halls. The students are asking Science teachers questions such as, "How can it be raining outside, but the humidity isn't 100%?, How can the humidity outside be 100%, but it's not raining?, Why do hurricanes rotate counterclockwise?, Why are the surface water temperatures in the northern Atlantic Ocean so high?, and What is the dew point, and what does it mean for today's forecast?"

Anyone can access our school's live weather information by going to the WeatherBug website at www.WeatherBug.com. It is also possible that our school/data will be featured on one of the WGN Channel 9 weather broadcasts.

Freshmen Conferences

The counselors are currently meeting individually with the freshman and should be done with the meetings by the end of first semester. This meeting will assist the student with getting to know their counselor, discuss current classes, develop a four year plan, and register them on Prep HQ. PrepHQ allows the students to track post-secondary interests, explore college information, and create a high school resume that will be utilized for either job or college applications. Students and parents may enroll and access this information at any time by going to www.wvshs.org, click Counseling Center, then PrepHQ. The username for each student is first name initial and last name, the password is his or her ID#.

Course Verification and Second Semester Schedule Distribution

On Tuesday, December 2, students will receive a Course Verification sheet during their 7th period class. This is a list of courses students are enrolled in for Second semester of this school year. Students and parents are asked to review the list and the student should contact the Counseling Center if any errors are found.

Any student wishing to change a Second semester elective has until Tuesday, December 9, at 2:30 to complete an appointment with his or her counselor to request an elective change.

Requests for elective changes will be honored only as space and scheduling constraints allow. Second semester schedules will then be handed out to students on Monday, December 15, during 7th period. If a student is absent that day, he or she should pick up the schedule from his or her teacher the next day during 7th period. Any schedule not picked up before winter break will be available for pick-up in the Counseling Center on January 5 beginning at 7am.

PSAE

During the junior year in high school, many students and families begin thinking about college admission. Part of the junior process involves taking tests such as the ACT. This year the **PSAE** (ACT plus WorkKeys) will be given on **April 22 and 23.** Student performance on these examinations is one of several factors used in the selection process of four-year colleges and universities. The best preparation for these tests continues to be the completion of a rigorous academic curriculum; however, there is evidence that familiarity with the format and content of these tests can be beneficial to students.

Several organizations in our area offer test preparation courses, two of which are held here at WWS. Through these courses, students can become familiar with the format and content of the ACT. WWS does not formally endorse any of these programs although ExcelEdge and Kaplan do distribute informational letters to students in early November through our English classes and we host their courses at WWS. The dates, availability, class time and fees vary for each program. We hope this information is helpful to you and your child as you look to the future.

The deadline for signing up for these programs is **Dec 18** and classes start right after winter break. You may contact either program at the following numbers or websites:
