**Allocations** – Ten Allocation requests were received and reviewed by the Allocation Committee on September 17, 2007. Those ten requests were presented for approval:

- 1. \$9,519.97 for staging expenses and recording equipment** for the Classics Show Choir. Motion to approve the purchase of recording equipment for \$449.82 was approved by the committee.
- 2. \$630.00 for Elmo projector** for the Math Department. Motion to approve purchase of \$630.00 for the Elmo was approved by the committee.
- 3. \$1099.90 for LCD projector** for Math Department. Motion to approve purchase of \$956.00 for LCD projector was approved by the committee.
- 4. \$1,419.85 for two Realityworks Babies** for Child Development Department and four car seats. Motion to approve \$1,219.85 to purchase two Realityworks Babies was approved by the committee.
- 5. \$2,244.00 for warm-ups** for the Gymnastics Department. Motion to approve purchase for warm-ups for \$2,244.00 was approved by the committee.
- 6. \$13,780.00 for Wireless Telex System** for the Drama/Auditorium. Motion to approve the support of \$7,780.00 so that the Drama Department can purchase of a Wireless Telex System was approved by the committee.
- 7. \$3,273.00 for three LCD projectors** for the Foreign Language Department. Motion to approve the purchase of three LCD projectors for \$3,273.00 was approved by the committee.
- 8. \$400.00 to cover raffle prizes** for Homecoming ticket sales was requested from Student Council. A motion to deny this request was made by the committee.
- 9. \$1,200.00 to purchase a Wireless Picture Frame** for the Principal's Office. A motion was made to hold this request till January by the committee.
- 10. \$4,918.00 to purchase cabinets** for cross country/track uniforms. A motion was made to hold this request till January by the committee.

**A total Allocation of \$16,552.67 was approved in the allocation process.** This was approved by Judy Niekelski and seconded by Chris Conway.

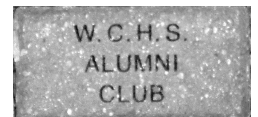

**PRINCIPAL'S REPORT – Dr. Snyder**

**Finals** will be held the last three days of the semester. The last day of the semester will be December 21.

**Drivers Education classes** will need updating to coincide with the new January 1 driving laws. A speaker will be presenting the changes that affect teen drivers at the next PAWS meeting.

**Parent Teacher Conferences** are scheduled for October 15, 16 & 18. A letter will be sent with the six week grades detailing how parents can sign up for conferences.

**Edline** is a new program that District 200 implemented so that parents and students can view grades online. Parents will receive access codes in the mail during the week of September 24-28. **ST. OLAF COLLEGE BAND  
 PLANS APPEARANCE IN WHEATON**

Concert at **Wheaton Warrenville South High School** is the **Only Tour Stop in Illinois**. The **St. Olaf Band**, *among the nation's top collegiate concert bands*, will be making an appearance in Wheaton as part of the band's annual fall concert tour. The Wheaton Warrenville South High School band program will host the concert on **Sunday, October 14, 2007 from 7:30-9:00 pm in the Auditorium.**

Students in Wheaton Warrenville South's Wind Ensemble will have the opportunity to rehearse with the St. Olaf Band and perform a piece on stage with them during the concert.

During their Fall 2007 tour the St. Olaf Band will be traveling and performing in eleven cities including Minneapolis, MN, La Crosse, WI, East Lansing, MI, and Interlochen, MI. Wheaton is the only tour stop in Illinois. The St. Olaf band is under the direction of Dr. Timothy Mahr, professor of music at St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN. Dr. Mahr is the also the principal conductor of the Twin Cities-based Minnesota Symphonic Winds. Active as a guest conductor and clinician, Mahr is in demand across the nation and internationally. Under Mahr's baton, the St. Olaf Band traveled to Norway in the summers of 1996 and 2005, Britain and Ireland in 2000 and Mexico in 2004. Since 1994, the St. Olaf Band has produced nine compact disc recordings, four of which have received international acclaim. Mahr is well known as a composer and has over 60 works to his credit

Founded in 1891 as the St. Olaf Cornet Band, the St. Olaf Band has developed over the decades into an ensemble noted for superb musicianship. Under the leadership of Dr. Mahr, the St. Olaf Band performs the very best compositions and transcriptions for the symphonic band, producing an exciting, crowd-pleasing style.

## FINANCIAL AID NIGHT

**Wheaton North High School** will be hosting this year's Financial Aid Night for both WWS and Wheaton North on **Tuesday, November 6, at 7:00pm in Taylor Auditorium.**

The night's presenter will be Allen Lentino, Senior Associate Director of Admission and Financial Aid at Northwestern University. Major topics covered will include:

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- A thorough understanding of the financial aid process; facts versus myths
- Where parental and student assets should be
- How income affects aid eligibility
- Dependent versus Independent
- The importance of deadlines
- Shopping financial aid packages

Financial planning and information gathering for college can never start too early, so parents of students in ninth through twelfth grade are encouraged to attend. We hope to see you there!

### Prep HQ

**Prep HQ** is an internet-based computer program that all students and families of Dist 200 have access to both at home and in school. This program can assist in 4-year planning Freshmen year as well as finding out times of college rep. visits, keeping track of college applications and scholarship information during Junior and Senior year. After their Freshmen meeting students will be able to access Prep HQ. Typically the student's screen name is their first initial of their first name followed by the last name; the ID number is typically their student ID number.

*Have you seen the new mural yet? If not, be sure to check it out. It is located in the common area outside of the counseling center.*

## Financial Aid & Scholarship Information

Want your student to attend the school of their choice but are afraid of the cost? This is a familiar refrain to many of us. However, there is money available through financial aid and scholarships in order to pay for that post secondary education.

**Merit based scholarships**, which are obtained regardless of financial security, can be earned through several methods. High grade point average, solid ACT or SAT test scores and athletic prowess are the most well known avenues. Others include awards for leadership, community service, and artistic or musical ability. Your company and/or union organization may set aside money for children of members. Local organizations from Wheaton and Warrenville generously provide many opportunities for seniors. Your student can simply visit our Counseling Center for details and applications or access *PrepHQ* online thru our website and click on the Scholarship link.

Most aid is awarded based upon **financial necessity**. Need-based aid comes in the form of scholarships, grants, loans, work-study. A federal student aid form called *FAFSA*, is the vehicle to access all forms of state and federal aid. The FAFSA form is typically submitted after January 1 via the Internet at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). The printed form is available in Counseling Center around Thanksgiving. Submit your application as soon as possible after January 1st. Some colleges also require the CSS/Profile. This can be completed by mail or via the internet and should be submitted in early fall.

Contact the financial aid office of the schools your student is interested in for specific scholarships and loans offered by those schools. For more information on financial aid, contact the Counseling Center at 630-784-7206 or access the web-sites below.
